Dr Meiting Lu's research focuses on the intersection of accounting, auditing and corporate governance. In particular, her research covers a range of international issues in financial and Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) reporting, auditing and assurance, and corporate governance, and aims to contribute to the on-going debate on the international convergence of accounting and auditing standards and its interactions with economic, political, cultural and institutional factors that are potentially overlooked in the policy setting. Meiting has published widely in international peer-review accounting journals such as Accounting and Finance, Pacific Basin Finance Journal, Asian Review of Accounting, Pacific Accounting Review and Australian Accounting Review.

Meiting's research has been funded by lots of competitive internal and external research grants, such as AFAANZ research grants, Early Career Research grants from both Macquarie University and University of Sydney, and MQ Research Infrastructure Scheme. Over the past five years, she has successfully supervised four PhD candidates and five Master of Research students, who have published their theses in international quality journals afterwards. Beyond providing mentorship to less experienced staff members at Macquarie, Meiting has been invited by a number of international universities to conduct research skills and topical workshops for their PhD students and early career researchers.
